<b>Punishment prescribed for each offense</b> (30.200(c)(4))	<b>For CM658-08:</b> Sentenced to one (1) year imprisonment, service ninety (90) days direct time, with credit for time served; pay fine of \$250 towards the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission Fund, plus

court costs; place on two (2) years of supervised probation, provide that the Defendant complete the following conditions:

- Shall not harass, threaten, physically strike, or injure the victim, [victim's name omitted];
- Shall report to the Client Services and Family Counseling Division of the court for intake and assessment. Shall follow all treatment recommendations including psychological evaluation, psychiatric evaluation, drug and alcohol evaluation, individual counseling, group counseling and/or family counseling;
- Shall report to the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center for an intake and a drug and alcohol assessment, and follow all treatment plans as may be recommended by the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center drug and alcohol assessment counselor;
- Defendant must attend and complete and pay the \$200 tuition fee of an Alcohol Treatment Program as ordered by the court;
- Shall report to the Alternative Sentencing Office to attend and successfully complete Anger Management classes, and shall pay any fees for the program;
- Shall report to the Adult Probation Division once a month in person, or as ordered by the Parole Services Division;
- Shall seek and attempt to maintain full-time legitimate employment, effective immediately, and that the Adult Probation Division shall monitor Defendant's progress on a monthly basis;
- Shall not possess or consume any alcoholic beverages, and shall not enter any establishments whose primary business is the sale of alcoholic beverages;
- Shall not possess or consume any illegal controlled substances;
- Shall not live in any residence where firearms are present and stay away from all firearms, and is not to possess, carry, transfer, or use any firearms;
- Shall forfeit his firearm identification card to the court and shall not reapply for another one;
- Shall not apply for, possess, or own a firearm identification card;
- All firearms must be removed from the Defendant's residence and surrendered to the Adult Probation Division until disposition of this case. Defendant is to surrender his firearms and firearms identification card to the Adult Probation Division. **18 U.S.C. § 922 makes it unlawful for any person subject to an order for protection or convicted of a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence to ship, transport, possess, or receive firearms or ammunition;**
- Shall turn in his passport and/or other travel documents to the Clerk of Court;
- Shall comply with any other reasonable condition imposed by the court or the Adult Probation Division;
- Shall comply with any court orders entered against the

	<p>Defendant, including orders of family court or any other local or federal court of competent jurisdiction;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Shall obey all local and federal laws; and,</li><li>- Shall not leave Guam without the approval of the court or Adult Probation Division, with prior notice being given to the Office of the Attorney General, Prosecution Division.</li></ul> <p><b>For CF515-10:</b> Sentenced to serve seven (7) years imprisonment, serve direct time of one (1) year imprisonment, and the remaining balance suspended, with credit for time served; pay fine of \$1000, plus Court costs; liable for full restitution, if any; place on parole for a term of three (3) years under the following terms and conditions:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Shall perform two hundred (200) hours of community service work under the direction of the Parole Services Division;</li><li>- Shall report to the Parole Services Division once a month in person, or as ordered by the Parole Services Division;</li><li>- Shall report to the Client Services and Family Counseling Division of the Court for intake and assessment. Shall follow all treatment recommendations including psychological evaluation, psychiatric evaluation, drug and alcohol evaluation, individual counseling, group counseling and/or family counseling;</li><li>- Shall report to the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center for an intake and a drug and alcohol assessment, and follow all treatment plans as may be recommended by the Guam Behavioral Health and Substance Abuse Drug and Alcohol Assessment Counselor;</li><li>- Shall undergo and successfully complete anger management counseling;</li><li>- Must attend and complete and pay the \$200 tuition fee of an Alcohol Treatment Program as ordered by the court;</li><li>- Shall not harass, threaten, physically strike, or injure the victim, [victim's name omitted];</li><li>- Shall stay away, directly and indirectly, from the victim [victim's name omitted]. Shall NOT CONTACT the victim either in person, through a third party, including a family member or friend, by telephone, text message, electronic device, e-mail, letter, or any other form of communication;</li><li>- Shall not come within five hundred (500) feet of the victim, [victim's name omitted];</li><li>- Shall stay away from the residence, dwelling, school, day care center, or place of employment of the victim, [victim's name omitted], or any other specified place, and shall not come within five hundred (500) feet of the above specified places;</li><li>- Shall not possess or consume any alcoholic beverages, and shall not enter any establishments whose primary business is the sale of alcoholic beverages;</li><li>- Shall not possess or consume any illegal controlled substances;</li><li>- Shall stay away from all firearms, and is not to possess, carry,</li></ul>
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	<p>transfer, or use any firearms;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Shall forfeit his firearm's identification card to the court, if he possesses one, and shall not reapply for another one. <b>18 U.S.C. § 922 makes it unlawful for any person subject to an order for protection or convicted of a misdemeanor crime of domestic violence to ship, transport, possess, or receive firearms or ammunition;</b></li><li>- Shall submit to random alcohol and drug testing under the supervision of the Parole Services Division;</li><li>- Shall permit Parole and police officers to search his person, residence, and vehicles for firearms, alcohol and illegal controlled substances at any time such a search is requested. Failure to allow such a search will be considered a violation of parole;</li><li>- Shall turn in his passport, and/or other travel documents to the Parole Services Division, if any;</li><li>- Shall seek and attempt to maintain full-time legitimate employment, effective immediately, and that the Parole Services Division shall monitor Defendant's progress on a monthly basis;</li><li>- Shall not leave Guam without the approval of the Court or Parole Services Division, with prior notice being given to the Office of the Attorney General, Prosecution Division;</li><li>- Shall comply with any other conditions imposed by the Court or the Parole Board;</li><li>- Shall comply with any court orders entered against the Defendant, including orders of family court or any other local or federal court of competent jurisdiction; and</li><li>- Shall obey all local and federal laws.</li></ul> <p><b>For CF40-16:</b> Sentenced to thirty (30) months, with credit for time served, all suspended; place on parole for a period of two (2) years. That during this parole period, and along with the standard parole terms the following are recommended:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>- Shall stay away, directly and indirectly, from [victim's name omitted]. The defendant shall not contact the same by telephone, in writing, or through a third party, including a family member or friend;</li><li>- Shall not come within five hundred (500) feet of [victim's name omitted];</li><li>- Shall stay away from the residence, dwelling, school, day care center, or place of employment of [victim's name omitted] or any other specified place, and shall not come within five hundred (500) feet of the above specified places;</li><li>- Shall not attend any function and establishment, including family and social functions, if he knows or becomes aware that [victim's name omitted] presence, or planned presence, the Defendant shall immediately leave the function or establishment;</li></ul>

Shall follow all treatment recommendations including psychological evaluation, psychiatric evaluation, drug and alcohol evaluation, individual counseling, group counseling and family counseling;</li><li>- Shall comply with and pay fees to the Superior Court of Guam for Group Treatment through the Client Services and Family Counseling Division, Individual Counseling or Psychological Evaluation through the Client Services and Family Counseling Division, and the Domestic Abuse Project Workshop at the Alternative Sentencing Office, in compliance with the court's order;</li><li>- Shall report to the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center for an intake and a drug and alcohol assessment, and follow all treatment plans as may be recommended by the Guam Behavioral Health and Wellness Center drug and alcohol assessment counselor;</li><li>- Shall report to the Parole Office once a month in person, or as ordered by that office;</li><li>- Shall not possess or consume any alcoholic beverages, and shall not enter any establishments whose primary business is selling alcoholic beverages;</li><li>- Shall not possess or consume any illegal controlled substances;</li><li>- Shall not live in any residence where firearms are present and shall stay away from all firearms and other deadly weapons, and under no circumstances is he to possess, carry, transfer, or use any firearms;</li><li>- Shall submit to random alcohol and drug testing under the supervision of the Parole Office;</li><li>- Shall permit the parole officers and law enforcement officers to search his person, residence, and vehicles for firearms, alcoholic beverages and illegal controlled substances at any time such a search is requested. Failure to allow such a search will be considered a violation of parole;</li><li>- Shall turn in his passport and/or other travel documents to the Clerk of Court;</li><li>- Shall comply with any court orders entered against the Defendant, including orders of family court or any other local or federal court of competent jurisdiction;</li><li>- Shall not leave Guam without the approval of the court or Parole</li></ul>
